"My first experience with **AMUC** now marks a key point in my life. "Darren" was a churched young person from an upper middle-class church who on the first day of **AMUC** got his feet washed by "Bob" as part of a session.

Bob was a young man who came on **AMUC**, yet he was presently homeless. He had lived a life on drugs, being unemployed and was born with fetal alcohol syndrome; he was born with no fingers. As Bob washed Darren's feet both men began to cry and I felt God was doing something in both of them.

I took Darren aside afterwards and asked him about what was happening for him. He said, "I felt like I was Peter at the Last Supper and Jesus came to me as a homeless man with leprosy and was washing my feet. I felt so humbled and loved but also ashamed because I have never met any homeless people and I realised that I may never have met Jesus because He reveals himself in the least.

Then I took Bob aside and asked what had happened for him. He replied, "Isn't there a story in the bible about a prostitute who washed Jesus feet and he said, your sins are forgiven'? He said, "I felt that Jesus said that to me".

This story goes to the heart of **AMUC** and the heart of God for Australian Christians. We need to allow Scripture to expose our broken-ness and, as we connect with marginalised people we both find redemption together. We need each other. Does that make sense?
